Gourmet Potatoes

6 medium potatoes; cooked, peeled, and grated or chopped
1/3 cup green onions, chopped
8 oz shredded cheddar cheese
1 ½ cup sour cream
2 tablespoons butter, melted
Dill weed
Paprika

Mix all ingredients and place in a casserole dish. Top with dill weed and paprika. Bake uncovered at 350 degrees for one hour.

Kappa members represent a wide variety of experiences and interests. While many have spent their entire careers as classroom teachers, quite a few have been educators in other settings. These members all spent part of their careers as classified instructors in programs to enrich or remediate student learning.

As a classroom teacher, she was the recipient of a 2-year, Gates Technology Grant. She continues with her love of working with students by being involved in the Park Orchard Elementary "Active Readers" Program. This program provides a positive adult response to children reading outside the school day. Outside of teaching, Marlene enjoys quilting, gardening and of course, reading.

After moving across country to Kent, she began working as a Title I Reading and Math Instructional Assistant. Barbara has been Kappa's secretary and treasurer, and served on the Communications Committee. Barbara has been a Master Gardener since 1990, and volunteers with the Friends of the Covington Library.
